9	(g) Fees collected from the issuance of CDP permits shall be used to administer the
10	program and shall be paid into the DDOT Enterprise Fund for Transportation Initiatives,
11	established under section 9e of the Department of Transportation Establishment Act of 2002,
12	effective May 21, 2002 (D.C. Law 14-137; D.C. Official Code § 50-921.13).
